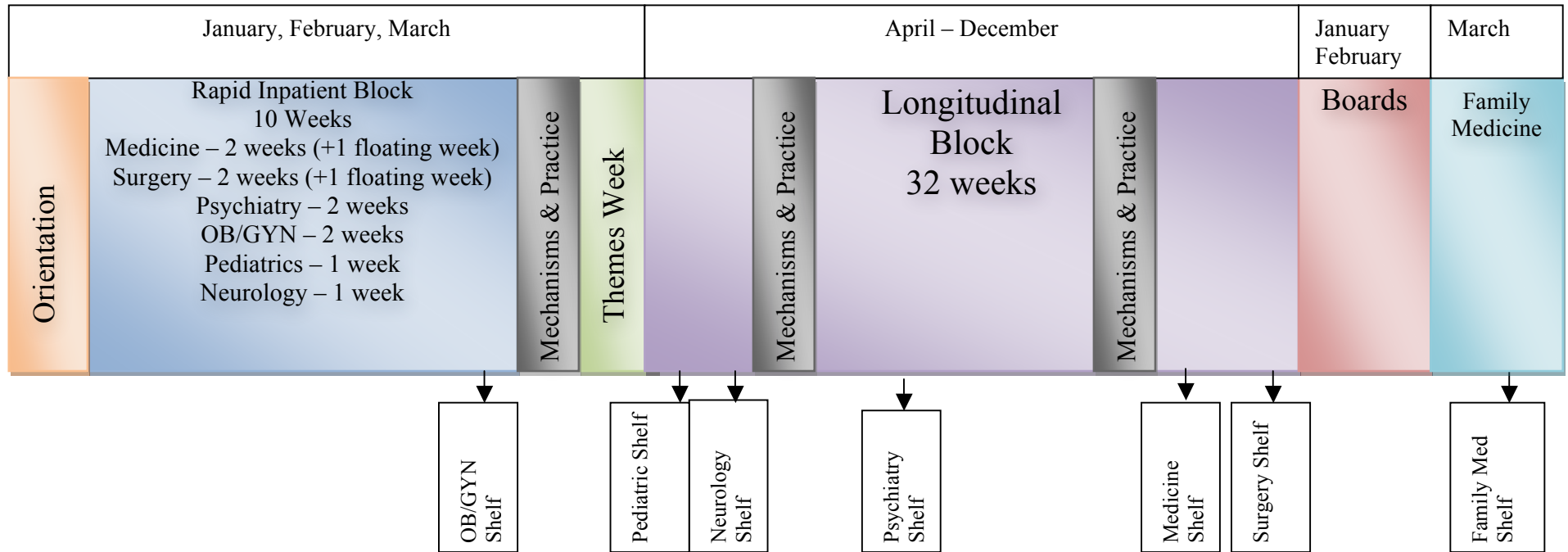


Columbia-Bassett Program Major Clinical Year (15 months)  
Students start on Cooperstown Campus in January of their 2<sup>nd</sup> Year



- **Rapid Inpatient Block:** Students spend 10 weeks on different inpatient services following a few days of orientation in Cooperstown.
- **Themes Week:** Process Improvement training, introduction to Bassett Institutional Committees, Process Improvement/SLIM project orientation, Epic (EMR) training, Meetings with organization leaders
- **Mechanisms & Practice weeks:** Students will return to New York City throughout the year and rejoin their classmates for a week of lectures and discussions building upon patient care experiences.
- **Longitudinal Block:**
  - This time is spent primarily following longitudinal patients, and when not doing so, in regularly scheduled outpatient clinics.
  - Students are required to take periodic ER call in the evenings.
  - Students will return to inpatient medicine and inpatient surgery for one week each (“floating weeks”) during the medicine and surgery didactic blocks at the end of the year, respectively.
- Didactics for upcoming shelf exam occur every Wednesday afternoon and consist of student-led presentations and case-discussions, under the guidance of a clinical preceptor. Other lecture series (Research curriculum, Radiology curriculum, Humanities reflection sessions, EKG reading sessions) will take place during this time as well.
- **Boards:** Students will not be assigned to any inpatient, longitudinal or call schedules as they will be studying to take their USMLE Step I. Students are not required to be in Cooperstown for this period.
- **Family Medicine:** Students will spend 4 dedicated weeks with their Family Medicine preceptor at a Bassett Regional Clinic. Students will have spent some time at this clinic periodically (once every 1-2 months) during the Longitudinal Block.
