EDUCATIONAL CONTRIBUTIONS

During my time as the Mental Well-Being Program Coordinator with the Wellness Resource Center at Temple University (2015-2016), I co-facilitated the "Brief Motivational Interviewing" (BMI) training (2-hour training, offered approximately once per month) that we offered to university faculty and staff to better manage challenging student behavior. I facilitated follow-up monthly lunches for participants in the BMI training. During the final months of my position, I also co-facilitated follow-up sessions with specific academic departments. In this position, I also supervised two students who worked as assistants to the Mental Well-Being Program Coordinator, as well as served as the staff supervisor to two student groups, People for Positivity and Active Minds. I also supervised the graphic design student who developed all the social marketing materials for the Wellness Resource Center. The Wellness Resource Center offers a 3-credit course to students interested in becoming certified peer health educators. During my time at the Wellness Resource Center, I taught the mental health content during one class session each semester (spring 2016, fall 2016). Additionally, I co-facilitated the Body Project (fall 2016) with the university dietician for a small group of female students around body image, societal expectations, and self-acceptance. Finally, I gave presentations campus-wide, as requested, around the following general areas: mental health, positive psychology, and brief motivational interviewing.
